To determine whether to give in principle support for a minor change to the boundary between the Launceston City Council and the George Town Council.

PREVIOUS COUNCIL CONSIDERATION:

RECOMMENDATION:

 - b) a boundary adjustment that would place the whole of a property at 400 Colgraves Road, Pipers River (PID 3030467 and 7248500, Title 458876/1) within the George Town municipal area.
- 2. That the State Government (Department of Premier and Cabinet) and the property owners be advised of the decision.

REPORT:

The Council has received a request, via the Division of Local Government, for consideration of a request to agree to a boundary change.

The details of the changes are:

- i.a boundary adjustment that would place the whole of a property at 262 Lees Road, Pipers River (PID 1549652 and 1549636, Title 47205/3) within the Launceston City municipal area; and
- ii. a boundary adjustment that would place the whole of a property at 400 Colgraves Road, Pipers River (PID 3030467 and 7248500, Title 458876/1) within the George Town municipal area.

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18.1 Council Boundary Adjustment (Minor)...(Cont'd)

Prior to the formation of the water corporation, staff had been undertaking some preliminary work where services crossed municipal boundaries. There hasn't been any active work on any minor (individual properties) boundary changes since that time.

The main issues that this type of change addresses is to remove a property from being serviced by and rated in two municipalities. From an operating perspective (services and rates) the impact would not be significant. Obviously the Council would not support wholesale changes that either increased service costs or reduced the rate base.

The Infrastructure Services and Development Services directorates have advised that there are no concerns with the two changes that have been requested.

The issues for the Council to determine is whether it is prepared to provide in principle agreement to individual requests or whether any changes would only be considered in a broader context.

Informal contact has been made with the George Town Council, but there hasn't been any advice to date of their position in regard to the request.

Conclusion

From a Council perspective no reasons have been identified to either support or oppose the requested change. It is reasonable to make minor adjustments that address local issues, however significant boundary changes would need to be considered in an overall strategic context with clear criteria for the adjustment.
