2012 7.1.1		In regard to Freelands Lookout off Bald Hill Road and Summit Drive Trevallyn. I understand that this lookout although in the West Tamar Council is maintained by the Launceston City Council. Sainty's Coaches operate half day tours around Launceston and the Tamar Valley and visit Freelands Lookout twice a day. I am concerned about the lack of maintenance and the view which is currently seriously compromised by native cherry trees that have been allowed to grow to a height on 2 to 3 metres. These trees are not on the skyline and are particularly unattractive. They are growing beneath the eucalypts and, with the exception of one small 'window', obliterate the view of the city and river. If native cherry trees were removed the view could be enjoyed by looking under and/or through the eucalypts which are on the skyline. Since September I have twice lodged an enquiry/complaint regarding these trees with Council. I have received to follow up phone calls, the latest in mid October from an	Reply by Director Infrastructure Services - Council's Parks and Recreation Department have inspected 'Freelands Lookout' and are satisfied with the level of maintenance; all firebreaks, road edges and open areas had all been cut as required. The central natural areas have long grass as is to be expected for natural bushland areas. From the main lookout area there is a clear view to the city centre and down the Tamar River Valley. The planted areas are mostly weed free and there is very little litter evident. There are some larger she-oaks that will be removed to further improve the view. Parks and Recreation will undertake this work progressively through the year as part of normal site maintenance.

- The definition of dilapidated buildings or structures should relate only to the impacts
 that a dilapidated building or structure has on amenity, rather than having to
 determine any loss a dilapidated building may be causing in the resale value of
 surrounding/adjoining premises;
- To improve consistency of decision making the definition of dilapidated buildings or structures should provide a series of 'guidelines' or 'tests' to determine if a building or structure is prejudicial to amenity of surrounding/adjoining premises;
- The proposed process for actioning dilapidated buildings or structures is unwieldy. Given the subjectivity of the assessment on whether a building or structure is dilapidated, and in the interest of natural justice, it does not seem appropriate for a General Manager to serve a Building notice on a property owner on the grounds that a building may be dilapidated. It is suggested that it would be more appropriate to refer such matters directly to the Council for a decision and that any action would follow a Council decision that a building is dilapidated in accordance with the Act; and
