HP1 - Cimitiere Street Heritage Precinct

HP1.1 Purpose

The following precinct provisions are intended to conserve the existing character and historic heritage significance of the precinct, to provide for new development that is commensurate with that significance and to encourage the recovery of significance, particularly in streetscape elements and presentation of the whole area.

HP1.2 Application of the Specific Precinct

Development Control Plan Areas

This applies to the development of land in Development Control Plan Areas 1-4 within the Cimitiere Street Heritage Precinct (Schedule 1).

HP1.3 Definition of Terms

Contributory the word Contributory identifies an element that contributes to the

Non-Contributory the word Non-Contributory identifies an element that contributes to

HP1.4 Cimitiere Street Heritage Precinct - Existing Character Statement

Historic Heritage Significance

The Cimitiere Street Precinct in Launceston is of historic cultural heritage significance as it demonstrates the development of a Tasmanian city through a range of built elements dating from the 1870s-1920s, particularly a rare form of housing with rows of terraces facing a central civic square. This homogenous collection of relatively modest houses of the Victorian period are located on a prominent urban thoroughfare surrounded by established gardens and parks, which form part of an arterial route into the central business district.
