ENTERPRISE GROWTH

Business Connect

- Facilitated the Start Up Your Hospitality Business event, featuring a panel of four guest speakers and networking opportunities for participants.
- Distributed Business Connect promotional posters throughout the Northern Suburbs and Launceston CBD
- Developed the Business Connect online hub and newsletter.

Multicultural Start-ups Program

- + My Place My Future is fostering new partnerships with migrant community groups, and supporting the development of micro and small business opportunities through supporting the facilitation of the Multicultural Start-ups Program (in collaboration with Catholic Care) in Launceston.
- This 10-week program is aimed at local migrant communities, those wanting to start a food business, but have not had the confidence or knowledge to do this.

NETWORK OF COMMUNITY ACTION GROUPS

My Place My Future is actively developing and supporting a network of place-based community action groups in the Northern Suburbs. This includes the Rocherlea Action Project Group, Community Together 7248 (Newnham/Mowbray), and a new group in Waverley/Ravenswood (name pending). The goal is to foster strong, supported, connected and thriving community-led groups.

LIVEABILITY

- My Place My Future continues to advocate for sustainable digital inclusion solutions in Tasmania, collaborating with 26TEN, Be Connected, Digital Ready for Daily Life & the Health Literacy Network.
- + Installation of another free Wi-Fi site at Heritage Forrest Community Garden, in conjunction with City of Launceston's ABCDE Learning Site.
- My Place My Future continues to collect and analyse data usage, and monitor established Wi-Fi sites in Rocherlea and Waverley.
- Hosted Let's Talk Road Safety in the Northern Suburbs community meeting in Ravenswood.
- Held Road Safety in the Northern Suburbs stakeholder and service provider meeting in Newnham.
- Supported community engagement activities with the Urban Greening Team at Torrens Park and Muylatina Child & Family Centre in Mayfield.
- Supported the Be Connected Digital Training workshop in Rocherlea.



ACCESSIBILITY

- + Improved community accessibility: The car park at the Shed in Rocherlea has been sealed for enhanced accessibility.
- + Addressing food security: City of Launceston Councillors have approved the leasing of land to the FaRM Project to establish a community market garden and develop a social enterprise.
- Enhanced access to health services: Facilitated the development of an immunisation program at Muylatina Child & Family Centre in Mayfield.
- Promoting community safety: The Ravenswood Skate Park received \$15,000 in Australian Government funding to complete landscaping, improving safety for the community.
- Ensuring community safety: Secured turf at GroWaverley to enhance community access and safety.
